

Happy New Year to you all: my twenty-first with the band as your conductor!!!

Thank you for all your efforts during the Christmas season; with once again standing ovations at all our concerts. Thank you especially to the many of you who also turned out for the Christmas Eve crib service at St. Laurence and then on to the QMC to play on Lisa's wards and also to Clive, Lizzie and Isobel (making her debut on percussion) for their help at our Duchess Theatre Christmas concerts and to Sarah who did a sterling job on Flugel with the band at the evening concert. I have had tremendous feedback from all our Christmas concerts, especially at the Duchess Theatre,

where they sold over 185 tickets (52% of the available tickets) for the 2020 Christmas concerts on the night!

Well done too to the award winners: Yeti, Alice, Alfie, Frederique and Josh. Thank you especially to Yeti for taking over the newsletter and website, and for implementing his new system for you to record your availability for band jobs, which has been a big help during our busy Christmas season (as well as playing solo horn very well).

Over the next 9 weeks, the senior band changes their focus from concerts to the NEMBBA and Area contests. These weeks are when we have time to solely focus on our playing technique (the usual intonation, balance, starting and ending the correct notes together, dynamics and especially watching me for tempo changes), and being the very best that we can be.

We have made further progress as a band during the Remembrance and Christmas concert seasons, and I was especially pleased with how we played at our Duchess Theatre concerts, but there is always room for improvement. Working on Endurance for the next few weeks, will benefit all of us, and of course we then apply the lessons learned to our future concerts. Although our training band does not contest, they also now have a break from concerts during which we can also focus our playing standard whilst we prepare our spring and summer concert programmes.

As ever, I want everyone in the senior band to work on Endurance; yes, two weeks before the area we do need to reduce down to 25 brass players; but you are all valued members of the band and we can all benefit from the experience. Thanks for everything and here's to a happy successful 2020.


