**Word War II Medley** - Good tempo - confident start – moves well, good percussion noted. Could do with a bit more middles of the band for balance. Just speeds up a little bit in Great Escape.

#### **More Hits**

Super Trouper - Again v. good. Percussion noted. Good tempo and style.

**Tragedy** - Good start and rhythmic drive. Builds well to the big tune. Sop is heard! Well done.

**Such Love** - Confident start from cornet soloist – well done – keep the air flowing though (band needs to try to play quietly to accompany soloist). Nice band sounds at E.

#### **Stage Favourites**

Starts well. Kit drummer helps very well here – good effort at dynamics to close.

Minnie – Good, confident to open + singing! (great 3 rd cornet contribution)

12 th – very enjoyable.

Adjudicator's Comments (Dark Side of the Moon) John Roberts

Opening is atmospheric + rhythmically accurate in the quaver crotchet figures.  $\bf B$  good start, the troms not in tune bar 4. Better to  $\bf D$  – good balance – only slight tuning issues in horns.

**E** - Good ct. figures are heard + euphs works well together. **K** - a little hesitant here.

 ${f L}$  - Glock is prominent as others leave – good effects here,  ${f M}$  - good control s. ct.  ${f N}$  is a little flat on Ds in particular.

O good bass sounds are heard against persistent cornet figure. P a little sticky here Q works well

**R** Good broad style **S** keeps moving well with good euph contribution noted.

**T** not as well in tune as earlier to begin this section.

f U builds well to f V good rhythmic pulse f CC good change of gear

A strong close to a good performance
