New Band Record

On Sunday 17th, Sharon will become the first musical director of the band to conduct us at a fifth national finals (2002, 2003, 2006, 2012, 2023); previously she held the record jointly with the late Arthur Marshall (1951, 1963, 1965, 1966). Lisa, Roy, James, Kim, and Rob have also played at all these contests.

Tonfanau

Congratulations to Sarah (Measures) who set a new personal best lap time on her 197cc Greaves road-bike at the recent August Tonfanau meeting, coming second overall in her class of up to 250cc single cylinder class machines, beating all but one of the bespoke racing bikes. Sarah finished third in the overall 2023 championship (12 races over 4 meetings) on a tie-break, level on points with 2nd place and ahead of Ben in fourth place with Beardy Stu also having a good meeting.



Tonfanau Brass

A group of us attended Tonfanau to support Team Measures and joined up to give a short concert to two of Sarah's friends on the Saturday evening, whose birthday it was. Most of the paddock came to listen (including one from a rival band at the nationals) and we asked to give a second performance on Sunday evening. Notes from the Musical Director



It is now less than two weeks before we go to Cheltenham to play in the National Brass Band Championships of Great Britain. It is a privilege to play at the national finals, and we should feel proud of what we have achieved. Sixteen of us (including myself) started playing within our training band and it is unlikely that any band in any section can rival that. The band is playing very well, although we still have a few things to work on, and I am hopeful that we will do very well. If we win, we are promoted to the second section, otherwise we need one more good result at next year's area contest for promotion.

Thank you to Macca for taking rehearsals whilst I was on holiday. The training band too is playing well, and we have decided on our programme for our next contest on the 5th November at The Whitworth. Thank you also to James for taking training band rehearsals whilst I was on holiday.

One of our great strengths is our low turnover of players: occasionally we have some players who need to move away for work or who retire from playing, but we rarely have players who transfer to other local bands (and most of them come back). This allows us to always have a full band, with gaps usually filled by a steady progression of players from our training band. Amazingly, from our winning band in 2006, ten of us will be contesting for the band at Cheltenham again this year. Thank you to everyone for all your hard work over the last few months (and years) and I am looking forward to our performance at Cheltenham.

We are sad to announce the death of our vice-president, Len Cowley, after a long illness. Len was one of our most enthusiastic supporters, rarely missing a rehearsal or concert by either of our bands, and during his illness spending much of his time listening to our CD and old video recordings. Len was elected vice-president in 2010, but his close association with the band goes back to 2005 when we were asked to resume leading the Remembrance parade in Long Eaton.

Len donated a new arrangement of the British Legion march to the band for us to play on the parade (the first of many generous donations) and returned with the band to our old club afterwards for refreshments. We gave him one of our centenary badges which had just arrived in time for our celebrations in 2006 and from then onwards he was a member of the band.

Len's funeral is on Tuesday 11th September at 1:15 p.m. at Bramcote Crematorium, where the band will be playing, including one of Len's favourite marches, 1914, which we played at his 90th birthday party.


