Notes from the Musical Director



Thank you for all your hard work so far as we prepare for the area contest this weekend. Overall, I thought we played fairly well at NEMBBA given it was then three weeks to the area, and whilst the result was a little disappointing, we knew we were not yet ready to deliver our best performance. Thank you to Graham for helping us our on flugel, to Andrew for covering bass trombone for us, and to Jo on euphonium, whom we are now delighted to welcome to the band as a full member.

We made considerable progress in the following week after NEMBBA, which is reflected in the remarks from the area preview organised by Newstead Brass, and we have continued to improve over the last two weeks. Our biggest problem now is that, whilst when we focus on the parts and remember all we have discussed in rehearsal we can

play really well, too often we need several goes to eradicate the careless errors beforehand. At the area, we only get one go, and so we need to learn to really focus on playing our parts from the start of each rehearsal.

Finally, a big thank you to everyone who played for the training band at NEMBBA. We put out a band of over forty players, all of whom play regularly for us, and really impressed our adjudicator. Thank you to Mareika for her kind remarks afterwards and well done especially to Henry for winning the best instrumentalist award and to Dan for another standout performance on kit.

Adjudicator's Comments Mareika Gray

- 1. (Supercalifragilisticexpialidocious) Confident stuff. All very neat + tidy. Odd tuning moment esp. on the chord/note.
- 2. (Chitty Chitty Bang Bang) You have a great perc. player. Really drives the band. Good spirited playing.
- 3. (Pirate of the Caribbean) Good! Maybe a little more difference between non-accented + accented notes.
- 4. (Sunshine Of Your Smile) What a confident player you are! You have a natural desire/ability to stay in time. Maybe next time a little more dynamic contrast.
- 5. (Minnie The Moocher) Great piece and well played! I think the band more than capable to make more of accents/dynamics. Again fab kit playing!
- 6. (12th Street Rag) Fab playing, good basses. Again more difference between accented and non-accented notes.
- 7. (Instant Concert) Good choice! Haven't heard it for years. Thank you. The band is so capable! You could get so much more from the music. Accents, dynamic contrast, controlling < from the band, not just the perc. Well done to the whole perc. team for this one!

Well done. I'm your newest fan. Great spirit + drive. Well done to your fabulous M.D.

Adjudicator's Comments Mark Wilkinson

Confident to open – tuning generally secure. Watch speeds of triplets as passed around the band.

- **13** Good articulated playing, not always secure in pitch and speeds of semi-quavers (tend to push). Can add < to the to help the fanfare figures. Good solo contributions. Musical flow is maintained. **85** Good troms but can take more volume for the f. Builds to a strong close.
- **2** You take the risks dynamically and the flow is maintained. Can take a little more shape within phrases. **25** Full sounds and good balancing. Nice solo contributions + secure close.
- **3** Can take more 'punch' to open as well as volume. The playing is articulated but we loose a little tempo through the melodic sections. 80 Becomes a little scrappy, don't lengthen the notes too much. The drive returns with good balancing. Builds to a string close.

Overall lots to admire. Good basses *(or basics)* and individual contributions. Can take more transparency in dynamic contrasts and overdoing any detail.

Keep up the good work.

Notes from the Summit Centre, Kirkby-in-Ashfield (Area Preview Evening by Newstead Brass)

Adjudicator's Comments Colum O'Shea

- I. Sustain crescendo bar 2. A little more rit. for style. Nice link to 13. 13 less floor tom more timp please. Style of articulation needs more uniformity. 32 takes time to settle. Nice horns. Good bass drive at 52. 69 Watch dynamic layers. Lovely temple block. 85 good trom style. Nice close.
- **II**. Good opening. Basses no cresc. on demisemiquavers please. **9** More dynamic shape please. **21** accomp cresc in **22** not effective. Careful to keep dynamic at f sustained. **37** mf vs. pp not clearly defined. **45** to the close a little uncertain. Nice solo cornet throughout the movement.
- **III.** Tempo takes time to settle. fp could be more effective. Maybe leave cresc. later? **23** basses hold f before subito mf. **39** articulation must be more obvious in accents. Troms cleaner at **52** please. Nice to **80**. Sound quality at **80** is lost slightly. Crotchet triplets drag at **110**. Molto Rallentando notes could get longer with rall?

Overall find the dynamic layers + contrasts of articulation and style in this piece. You do so much of this already by really go for it. Well done troms. Nice teamwork. Well shaped M.D. Thank you.
