The Fred & Mavis Aram Memorial Shield

This year we are retiring the Proactif Shield (donated by Kim and her ex-husband in 2002), which is awarded to the most improved senior band player of the year, but which is now full.

In its place, this year's most improved player will be awarded The Fred & Mavis Aram Memorial Shield, in memory of our former vice-president, chairman and cornet player, Fred Aram, and his wife Mavis, both of whom we lost last year.

Welcome

Band Changes

Congratulations to Thomas (baritone), Alfie (tenor horn), Ruth (cornet), Liz (tenor horn), and Geoff (cornet) who have all moved up to our training band (which now has 56 members, including 22 cornet players!). A special congratulations to Ruth, who has progressed from our beginner's group in less than two months. We now have 99 players within our organisation!

In other moves, Catherine is taking a break from band until after Christmas due to her new job. Elaine has moved from second cornet to cover flugel for the rest of the year, whilst Tracey has reclaimed her second cornet seat next to Roy.

New Music

The band is most grateful to both Hucknall & Linby MC Band and Brian Draper, who have both donated music to the band.

Corporation Tax

The band has made its corporation tax returns, which has involved reworking our accounts back to 2020 to recast them to the return periods required by HMRC and then delving into the mysteries of depreciation and capital allowances. Many thanks to Carl for all his assistance: the alternative would have been paying an accountant around £1,200 to prove we did not owe any tax. Sadly, a change in HMRC policy means that we must now purchase specialist software for our future returns: not paying corporation tax is an expensive business (pun intended)!

New Tenor Horn

The band has purchased a new £5,000 tenor horn for Karen: please be very careful in her vicinity – the smallest dint or scratch may prove fatal!

There are one or two passages which need some more rehearsal, and we need to think more about coming off together at the end of phrases, especially in Mother of God, which we need to also carry forward into our test piece performances. Thank you to our deps, Alan, Catherine, Calvin and Emma for covering players at work, on holiday or who were ill, and to Andrew who moved from trombone to cover 2nd baritone for us, again due to band illness.

We now have a further five concerts before the Remembrance Sunday, a final week to prepare for the NEMBBA contest, and then we are into the Christmas season: a busy few months. Please remember to complete Vento, so I know who is available for each job (and if I need to find deps). You do have the "Maybe" option if you are not sure.

I am delighted to announce that the training band has now reached 27 players, the size of a full brass band! All we need now are volunteers for soprano, flugel horn, bass trombone and three volunteers for bass (and the basses for them to play on!) and we can cover all the parts. The training band had only one member when I took it over in 2001: a fifth of the senior band (Melissa, Stuart, Zoe, Emma, George, Jacob and Joe) have now been promoted from the training band — and there are others on their way! The training band's signature march "Look to the Future" says its all.

On the senior band front, the concert in Beeston was very well received. Well done! We are not entering any contests this autumn – instead we will be recording a CD during the first weekend in December (the programme will largely be the same as at Beeston). This means not only intensive rehearsals (since we need to be note perfect when we record ourselves for posterity), but a hard weekend, since we also have jobs on the Friday and Monday. I realise that the timings are unfortunate, but we need to get the CD done this year in

time for our centenary next year, and McTuba's father is coming all the way down from Scotland to record us for expenses only. 
