Band Room News

Ted Bradley

With great sadness, we announce the passing of Ted Bradley, former player and conductor of our band. He peacefully passed away last Saturday afternoon, surrounded by his family.

Ted first learned to play in the band in 1946 and briefly left the band to play principal euphonium for the Scots Guards during his national service in the 1950s. On his return to the band, he gained recognition as one of the finest euphonium players in the Midlands. Most euphonium players around the world will have played Grandfather's Clock: Ted was the first: the composer, George Doughty, brought it to Long Eaton to hear it played before he published it. Ted took over as conductor of the band for three years in 1975 and in 2002 returned to join our "lovely basses".

Surpassing Ted's successes as a player was his work as a novice teacher. Many bands around the country have benefitted from players first taught by Ted at Long Eaton. In total, Ted spent more than 80 years involved in banding (48 with Long Eaton), being awarded his 80 years long service award at the NEMBBA contest in 2024. A teacher and mentor to many of us, Ted was a huge character within the band, and we have so many memories of him.

Always one to say exactly what he thought, Ted brought light and laughter to many of the band's greatest moments. We remember him fondly and will miss him sorely.

Thank you, Ted, for everything.

Francis Skinner

Francis was awarded her 50 year long service award at the recent NEMBBA contest but was already too ill to receive it. We send our condolences to her family.

Adjudicator's Comments

Sandy Smith

Look To The Future: Confident start with good dynamics immediately evident. Good trombones noted in the second section and great accented articulation. A lovely p at **42** and good control throughout. A lovely start.

Song Without Words (Ct. Solo): A controlled and subtle start. The soloist is lyrical and secure with lovely shaped phrases. At **D** keep the solo line "singing" – even at f. Most of the accompaniment detail is heard and well controlled. Great ending from the soloist. Bravo Henry!

Little Ted's Tuba: The tempo is so well chosen and impressive dynamic control is again very evident in the playing. Soloist is lyrical at **B** and the general balance is very good. A really enjoyable, fun item! Thank you soloist!

Young Amadeus: Control is again good. Maybe just let the main melody "lead" a little more at times. Great lift into the change of key. Impressive dynamic control yet again. Lovely, relaxed playing.

Pastime with Good Company: Rhythmic and stylish introduction. **B** The lead melody line could come out a little more. The ensemble is tight and you build to a very effective ending.

Thank you for a performance especially notable for its control of ensemble and dynamics. A real joy to listen to.

Adjudicator's Comments

Sandy Smith

Olympus: The opening is strong. Keep an eye on the balance. The attention to dynamic detail is good! Don't let the low percussion dominate too much. **F** works well. The build from **H** to **J** also works but I lose some internal detail in some of the "scrunchy" chords.

Transition into L if effective. The cornet is characterful. Some of the solo voices could "sing" more.

"The Olympic Flame" is well controlled with shape from the MD and a god eye on the balance. Some of the solo lines could "sing" more. Watch the breathing horns in the melody line before \mathbf{P} – it does sound a little "haphazard" in places – have you marked them in. \mathbf{S} – bravo horns. This is building well in excitement with good control.

W loses a bit of energy because of the dynamic. I lose a little of the more technical passages towards the end.

A well thought out performance from the MD with good shape and structure in the performance noted.

Soloists – keep working on the lyricism of your solo lines.

Notes from the Musical Director

Overshadowing our contest and concerts successes last month is the death last Saturday of my teacher and mentor, Ted Bradley after a long illness. Everything we achieved together in the last 26 years at Long Eaton would not have been possible without Ted, who gave up his time to teach me and many others to play brass instruments all those years ago. Ted returned to band in December 2002 and shared in our successes and disappointments for another twenty years until ill health finally compelled him to give up playing after a total of 48 years with the band. We will all miss him.

Thank you for all your hard work this month, during which we have had the NEMBBA contest, two important concerts, the Remembrance parade, and six Christmas Lights carol concerts.

The concert for Ilkeston Royal British Legion overall went very well and we have already been booked for next year. Thank you to Sheila and Calvin for covering for players on holiday, and especially to Ian on percussion, who had to play the first few pieces with no music. This year's Librarian's wooden spoon award goes to The Librarians! I have also received lots of good feedback from the concert at The Winding Wheel: again, work shifts, holidays and illness within the band were an issue: thank you to Mike, Calvin, Dr. Chris, Mark and Ben for helping us out.

I was delighted with the training band's performance at the NEMBBA contest: whilst, as in February, we were the only band in the section, we again received some superb adjudicator's comments. Maintaining balance across a good range of dynamics is something many contesting bands fail to always achieve. Thank you for all your hard work in rehearsal – it really paid off. Well done also to Henry for winning the inaugural NEMBBA soloist's medal.

I was also pleased with the senior band's performance in the third section: my first contest on principal cornet for the band for over 45 years! Well done to James for winning his first contest as a conductor. The remarks highlight a few things to work on for the area, but we are moving in the right direction as a band.

Thank you to the 20 of you who played carols on a very cold night in Ockbrook, the 30 who turned out to play at 5:30 p.m. for the Long Eaton Christmas Lights and then the 23 who played at Borrowash. We followed this by playing at Swaley, Sandiacre and Draycott last Saturday. Thank you to everyone who managed to rearrange their days so they could come and perform with the band. As usual, all of our audiences have been very appreciative.

This month we continue our busy schedule, with concerts at St. Laurence, Longcliffe Gold Club and the Duchess Theatre together a number of carol concerts, before finishing with the crib service at St. Laurence on Christmas Eve. Our training band is also busy, with a concert at St. Mary's Church Hall in Draycott, and playing carols for the Scout and Guides service in All Saints, Sawley and in support of the Beavers (also in Sawley).

Finally, thank you for all your hard work this year, and I wish you all a Merry Christmas and a Happy, Successful New Year!
